The Oneida Nation of the Thames is a First Nations Settlement located near the City of London, Ontario. Standing Stone School is a JK to Grade 6 facility, serving 190 students. After Grade 6, students are enrolled in schools in the local Provincial Board through a tuition agreement. The Life Long Learning Division oversees the education of the children of the Oneida Nation of the Thames and provides attractive employment opportunities in small, community supported school.

### QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Ontario College of Teachers Certificate in good standing;
2. Preference to candidates with experience or educational qualifications to work in a First Nation school environment.

### REQUIREMENTS:

1. The successful candidate will submit a VS-CPIC completed within the past six (6) months, prior to starting employment, at own expense;
2. The successful candidate will submit other documentation deemed relevant may be required.
